

Richard Chamberlain

Our first inductee is Richard Chamberlain. In 1960-61, Richard was part of the Warren County Basketball Tournament Championship team where he was first team All-County and averaged 17.3 points per game. Richard tied for first place at the district meet in the high jump, setting a school record of 6'1". He high jumped in the State meet. Richard was also a varsity letterman in baseball as a pitcher that same spring season.

In 1961-62, he was Dayton Daily News All Little Buckeye League first team offensive end in football. His basketball team won the Warren County League and Tournament, and was district runners-up. Individually, Richard was first team All-County, second team All-State, and received a full athletic scholarship in basketball to Miami University. He holds CHS basketball records of most points in a game at 49; most points in a season at 751 and highest single season average of 30.0 points per game. In track and field that same year, he was the only athlete to ever win 4 events in the Warren County track meet with victories in the discus, the shot put, 440-dash and the high jump, setting a county record of 5'10". Richard held Carlisle records in the high jump, 440 dash and discus. He participated in the high jump and discus at the state meet that year.

While at Miami University, Richard received 3 varsity letters in basketball, the Marshall North Award for spirit and hustle, and played in first round of the NCAA tournament as a senior. He also received 3 varsity letters in track and field, placing 2nd in the discus in the 1966 MAC track and field championships. Richard returned to his hometown of Carlisle in 1970-75 where he taught and coached track and field. In 1974 the track and field team had an undefeated regular season and won the Dayton Suburban League Track Championships. 2014 inductee...Richard Chamberlain
