The fifth inductee is Larry McIntosh. Larry was a 3 year varsity starter for the Carlisle basketball team. During Larry's junior year the team had a 20-2 record and he was named to the All County League first team and All County Tournament first team. In his senior season, he was captain of the team and was named again to the All County League first team and All County Tournament first team. He was chosen captain of the tournament team as well. While playing in the All County tournament he scored a record of 37 points in a game with Harveysburg. Larry was named to the All District first team and honorable mention All State.

After graduation, Larry went to work for the National Cash Register Company in Dayton and played for their AAU basketball team for four years. In the 1961-62 season, he led the league in scoring and was recruited by the University of Tennessee new head coach, Ray Mears, who gave him a 4 year athletic basketball scholarship. During his freshman year, he led the team with scoring 17 points per game and was named to the All Southeastern Conference freshman team. As a sophomore, he started for the varsity team and was named to the All Southeastern Conference sophomore team. In the 1965-66 season, he was named co-captain of the varsity basketball team. During three seasons as a varsity player, Larry earned the Tennessee trophy, which is given to the player that gives 110% at all times.
