

ATTENTION KINDERGARTEN PARENTS

All incoming kindergarteners must have the following vaccines prior to starting school:

5-DPT (last dose after age 4)

4-Polio (last dose after age 4)

3-Hepatitis B

2-Chicken Pox (varicella)

2-MMR

Any student not up to date will be excluded from school starting September 6th, 2023, and all absences are unexcused.

Wellness Grant by EPC Program approved for staff wellness.

District Nurses Rebecca Baker and Erica Brown worked with the EPC program to apply for a wellness grant funds which was approved early this school year. The money allotted by the grant is used for staff wellness activities throughout the year. The activities included free Yoga and Zumba classes for staff after school and a lunch and Learn activity by *Dished!* for healthy lunch ideas. Staff also have had the opportunity to participate in several wellness activities this year, the activities earned a prize such as a YETI water bottle or chances to win a gift card. The activities included a water challenge, wellness bingo, steps challenge, mobile mammogram screenings, blood pressure screenings, flu shots and gratitude journals. Upcoming activities for staff include chair massages and a catered healthy lunch. Any extra funds from the wellness grant will be used to purchase scales and other health resources for future staff use. Staff have given positive feedback on the activities provided so far. The goal is to continue to build wellness activities each year and increase participation. Becca and Erica hope the EPC program will offer the grant again next school year so these activities can be continued and increase staff participation.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2023-2024 - Parents, if you will be registering a child for Kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year, you need to complete the registration process online through Final Forms. Please visit the Carlisle Local Schools website (at www.carlisleindians.org). Along the top of the home page, please click 'Enrollment' and follow the directions. If you have any questions or problems, please call the school at (937) 746-8969 to speak with Mrs. Casson, the Attendance Secretary.

In order for a child to be eligible to attend Kindergarten during the 2023-2024 school year, he/she must be 5 years of age on or before August 1, 2023.

You will be able to submit all documents online and will NOT need to make an appointment to come in to the school. In order to complete the registration process, you will need to submit the following items (online): your child's birth certificate, any applicable custody papers, shot/immunization records for your child, parent/guardian driver's license, and proof of residency within the district (**ONE** of the following: Rent/Lease Agreement, Mortgage Account Statement/Mortgage Coupon Book, Settlement Statement, Copy of Deed, Land/Purchase Contract).

We would appreciate parents completing the registration process as soon as possible – this helps us tremendously as we form class lists for the upcoming school year. If you have any questions, please be sure to call the school or email Mrs. Casson (Nikki.Casson@carlisleindians.org).

All students in grades 4 to 6 will continue to have access to two learning programs for free over the summer. Students can get on Edmentum.com and Mobymax.com over the summer at home for free. Both programs help students with reading and math skills. Students on MobyMax can also get enrichment activities for science. Both programs differentiate their content based on your child's need. If students do these programs 30 to 60 minutes weekly, it will help decrease the gaps that can occur over the summer.

Please check out your area libraries for summer learning opportunities too. We know that having your child read 20 minutes daily will help increase reading fluency over time. It is also appropriate to still read with them to set a good example for lifelong learning. Students should read materials that they are interested in for pleasure over the summer.
